With reference to your letter dated 5th February, records indicate that your father enlisted in the 39th Reserve Battalion, Canadian Expeditionary Force on 19th February, 1915, as "Edward Jackson". He arrived in England on 3rd July, 1915, and proceeded to France on 17th September, 1915, where he was taken on strength of the 13th Battalion, Canadian Infantry. He was wounded on 8th August, 1918, and invalided to England on 21st August, 1918, and returned to Canada on 2nd February, 1919.

A review of all relevant documents fails to reveal that the late Mr. Jackson was awarded the Distinguished Conduct Medal or Military Medal. However, he was awarded the 1914-15 Star, British War Medal and Victory Medal, which were mailed to him on 19th July, 1922, to 7 College Street, Toronto, Ontario, upon his request. Also War Service Badge, Class "A" No. 283464 was issued to him at the time of his discharge on 6th September, 1919. If his British War Medal and Victory Medal have become lost, you may have them replaced on prepayment, by forwarding a Postal Money Order for \$3.00 made payable to the RECEIVER GENERAL OF CANADA, to this Division in the attached addressed envelope, and replacement medals will be forwarded to you within a period of three weeks thereafter upon receipt from engravers.

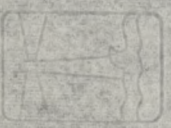
