He says he went to Toronto after his father's death and became a cook. As a worker, he has had a great many jobs, practically all over. He has done considerable sailing in the summer time, usually stayed on one boat for a few trips, then would get a job on another boat. He was all over New York state some years ago, and went into the Gowanda Hospital but his account of having got in there is very hazy. Says he was there in Nov. 1914 and was deported in April 1915 to Toronto where he went into the Reception Hospital and was later sent to Queen St.

He gives a history of auditory and visual hallucinations and had delusions of persecution, thought people were talking about him and trying to poison him. Had marked periods of exaltation and excitement during which he was very impulsive but he has never done any harm to any person and when at Queen St., he worked in the kitchen, at times went out with the Chef and occasionally he would go but for a few hours alone. The patient is a young man, 20 years of age, who has been suffering from a chronic illness of several years' duration. He has been treated with various medications, but with little success. He is now being treated with a new drug, and it is hoped that this will bring about a permanent cure.

The patient's symptoms are as follows: He has been suffering from a chronic cough, which is worse in the morning and at night. He also has a constant feeling of weakness and fatigue, and is unable to do his usual work. He has lost weight and has become very thin. He has also had some episodes of dizziness and fainting.

The patient's physical examination is as follows: He is thin and looks ill. His temperature is normal, his pulse is 90, and his blood pressure is 110/70. His lungs are clear, and there is no wheezing or crackles. His heart is normal in size and rhythm. His abdomen is soft and there is no tenderness. His stools are normal.

The patient's chest X-ray shows a normal heart size and no evidence of pneumonia or other lung disease. His sputum is normal. His blood work is as follows: Hemoglobin 12 g/l, Hematocrit 38%, White blood cells 10,000/cmm, with a normal differential. His serum electrolytes are normal.

The patient's condition is stable at present, and he is continuing to take his medication. He is being followed up in the clinic, and it is hoped that he will eventually be able to return to his normal state of health.

had not received any pay yet and did not think very much of it.

On the transport, he says the food was very bad and he raised a row about it and was going to lick one of the officers. He was put in detention and immediately on landing in England he was put in a Hospital, first at Seaforth and later at Shorncliffe. He says he told them a lot of foolish things in England that the people in the Battalion were all troubling him, that they put poison in his food and many things like that. He is very excitable at times, hears voices constantly and during these periods of excitement and bad temper, he has many forms of visual hallucinations.

He is very easily disturbed and has many outbreaks of excitement, ~~having attacks~~ only taking a few minutes to come but usually lasting 3 or 4 days.

He is a well developed case of Dementia Praecox of the Catatonic variety.

PAST ILLNESSES

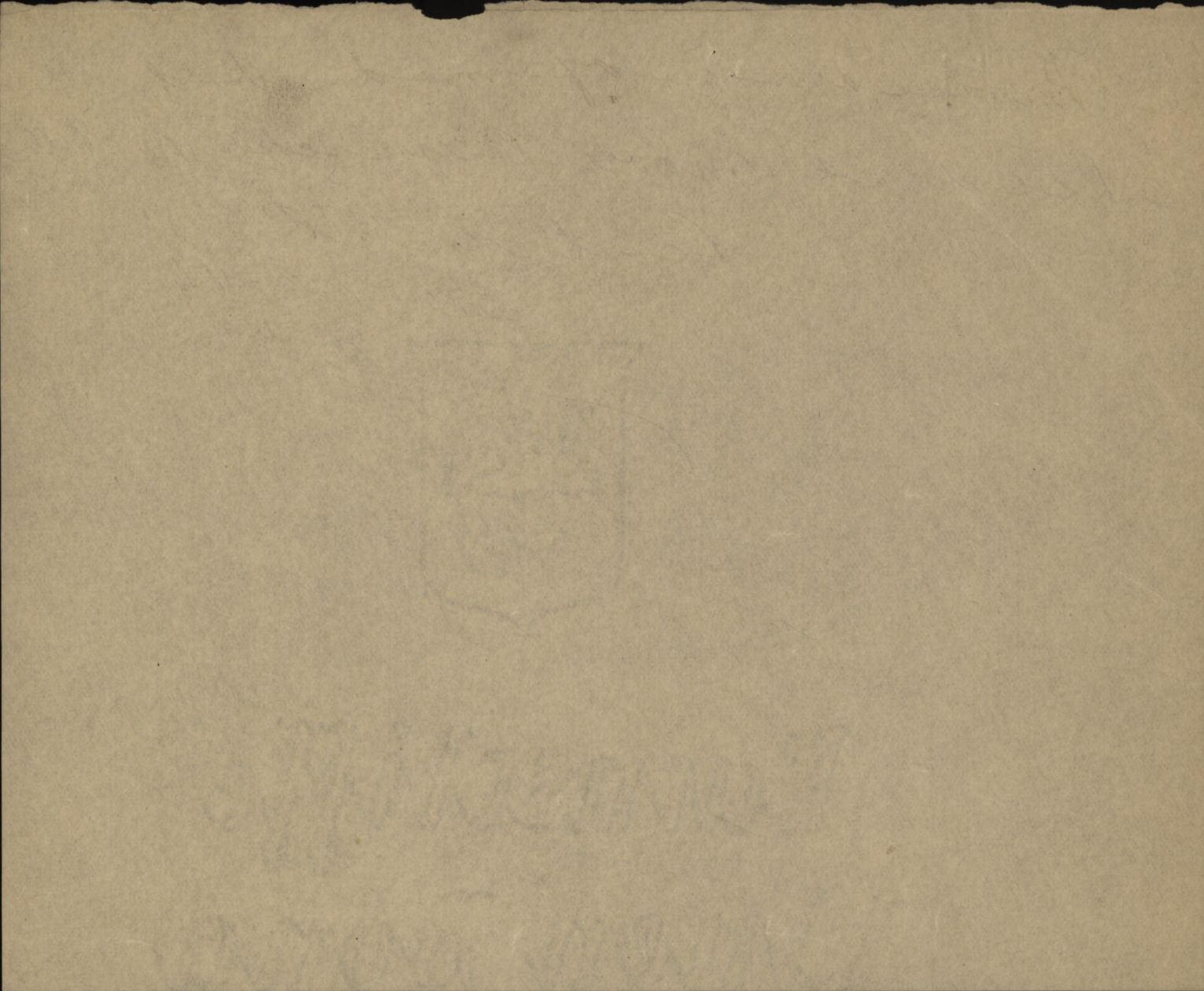

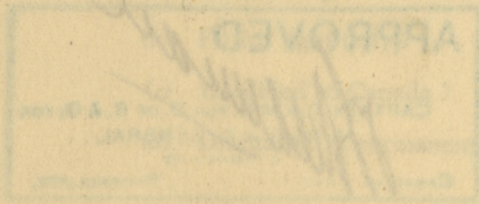
